FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID (FAFSA)

- Beware of SCAMS! This is a "FREE" application
- Administered by the Department of Education (ED)
- ALL families should complete not all aid is based on financial need
- Families will use their prior-prior year tax return
- Gateway to Federal State School financial aid

- High school senior and parent(s)
- Undergraduate dependent students and parent(s)
- 3. Undergraduate independent students
- 4. Graduate students

Don't Forget: You must RENEW the FAFSA annually!

FAFSA CHANGES AND UPDATES 2024-2025 ACADEMIC YEAR

The FAFSA Simplification Act

- Overhaul of processes and systems used to award federal student aid
- Includes the FAFSA form, needs analysis, and procedures for schools participating in federal student aid programs
- States that use the FAFSA to award state grant aid and every school participating in federal student aid programs

Why the changes?

- A more streamlined application process
- Expanded eligibility for federal student aid
- Expanded eligibility for the Federal Pell Grant.
- Reduced barriers for certain student populations
- A better user experience for the FAFSA form
- Enhanced data sharing with IRS

FAFSA CHANGES AND UPDATES 2024-2025 ACADEMIC YEAR

Summary of Changes

- Shorter more user-friendly 36 questions vs. 108
- Student Aid App has been retired
- Contributor will replace Student, Spouse, Parent
- The Student Aid Index (SAI), replaces the Expected Family Contribution (EFC)
- List up to 20 colleges vs 10
- Divorced parents the one who provides the most support
- Unusual circumstances the FAFSA allows contributors to continue
- FAFSA Submission Summary replaces the Student Aid Report (SAR)

FAFSA CHANGES AND UPDATES 2024-2025 ACADEMIC YEAR

Data Transfer and Import

- The new Direct Data Exchange (DDX) will replace the old IRS Data Retrieval Tool (DRT)
- EVERYONE who contributes to a FAFSA will be required to provide consent to transfer data from the IRS – this will include non-filers, people without Social Security Numbers, and foreign tax filers
- Federal tax filers will have their tax information imported into the FTI module no tax income will transfer into the FAFSA, but tax data will be sent to the colleges listed on the FAFSA

Providing Consent for Data Transfer

To provide consent, the individual will need to access the FAFSA with an FSA ID that has been matched with the Social Security Administration (SSA).

No consent = no federal aid.

About Creating An Account

- All contributors to the FAFSA will need to create an account
 - Students Parents Anyone submitting info on the FAFSA
- Authenticated by the SSA takes 1 -3 business days
- FSA ID does not expire must be reset if locked or the user forgets the username or password

You will need an FSA ID to:

- Complete and renew the FAFSA
- Complete and electronically sign federal master promissory notes (MPN)
- Access all federal student aid websites
- Federal loan counseling
- Apply for repayment plans

Applying without a Parent

If the student's parents are unwilling to provide information, the student can ask to be contacted by a financial aid administrator at their school to determine their eligibility for a Direct Unsubsidized Loan only.
